The Foundation focuses on holistic development through education, healthcare, skill training, and empowerment initiatives. With over 25 projects, the Foundation works tirelessly across urban and rural settings to empower children, women, youth, and persons with disabilities. The programs are implemented in collaboration with government agencies, local NGOs, corporate partners, and community stakeholders to empower underserved communities by providing access to essential resources, fostering sustainable development, and addressing systemic challenges such as poverty, illiteracy, and social exclusion.

THEME OF THE YEAR:

EMPOWERMENT OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITY THROUGH SKILLING AND EMPLOYMENT

According to the 2011 Census, there are 2.68 crore persons with disabilities in the country, accounting for 2.21 percent of the overall population. Public areas and services frequently lack accommodations for people with disabilities, limiting their mobility and involvement in society. They encounter significant barriers in employment due to workplace discrimination, inaccessible work environments, and limited vocational training opportunities.

Asha Deep Foundation believes that addressing challenges and promoting inclusive practices, along with Skill development training and Employment, can help ensure that individuals with disabilities lead fulfilling and independent lives.

Asha Deep Foundation, in collaboration with HCL FOUNDATION, supports specially-abled adults through comprehensive training and support programs. These programs include career opportunities, job offers, and soft skills development, aimed at promoting growth using innovative educational methods. The foundation empowers the differently abled community through various initiatives and offers food assistance. Additionally, it helps individuals obtain a UDID Certificate as part of the government's "Unique ID for Persons with Disabilities" initiative.

The empowerment of people with disabilities is a multifaceted effort that requires collaboration between government bodies, non-profit organizations, and communities. The ongoing commitment to disability rights and empowerment is essential for creating a more equitable and inclusive society for all.









NEW INITIATIVES

INTERNS FROM IMT GHAZIABAD

Each year, interns from IMT Ghaziabad actively contribute to the development and day-to-day functioning of Asha Deep Foundation. Their involvement spans a variety of meaningful activities including updating the organization's website, assisting with documentation, and preparing the Annual Report presentation.

They also engage directly with the children by conducting sports sessions, teaching basic computer skills, and supporting them academically—especially in subjects they find challenging. Beyond academics, the interns play a vital role in motivating the children, guiding them to set goals and think positively about their future career paths. Their presence brings fresh energy, creativity, and a spirit of encouragement that leaves a lasting impact.







INTERNS FROM CHRIST UNIVERSITY, GHAZIABAD

Interns from Christ University, Nandigram Ghaziabad, have actively contributed to the programs of Asha Deep Foundation by engaging with children through individual and group sessions. Their work focuses on understanding each child's family background, enhancing self-confidence, and equipping them with the skills to express and present themselves effectively in social settings. Through counselling, the interns identify any psychological or emotional concerns and provide appropriate guidance or referrals. They also help children gain the skills and confidence to engage meaningfully with the wider community, promoting inclusion and holistic development. Their involvement has created a supportive and nurturing environment for the children while strengthening the Foundation's interventions with fresh perspectives and valuable insights.

By bridging academic learning with practical experience, the interns not only enhance their professional skills but also leave a lasting positive impact on the lives of the children they work with.







SKILL TO SUCCEED DIRECT: CAREER CONNECT CENTER, CHENNAI

Skill to Succeed Direct empowers marginalized youth by providing essential 21st-century skills, digital literacy, and career readiness, enhancing their employability.

PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Skill to Succeed Direct project, implemented by the Asha Deep Foundation as part of Accenture Global's Skill to Succeed initiative, partners with Quest Alliance/Career connect center, a leader in education and employability, to empower youth at the grassroots level with valuable skill-building opportunities. The project aspires to empower adolescents and young adults, guiding them in their journey toward a seamless transition into the workforce or higher education.

OBJECTIVES

- Empower youth by providing essential life skills and career readiness competencies through blended and self-directed learning systems to prepare them for future success.
- Foster digital literacy and foundational technology skills, including a comprehensive introduction to artificial intelligence.
- Enhance awareness of diverse career pathways, current employment trends, market dynamics, and entrepreneurship opportunities.
- Support youth in making informed and confident decisions regarding their careers.
- Offer skill training alongside job placement assistance to facilitate seamless entry into the workforce.
- Promote language proficiency in basic English and advocate for a sustainable, green future.

IMPACT

This year, we successfully completed training three batches, each spanning three months. 85 trainees have completed the program, and 60 of these individuals have secured employment in key sectors, including Retail, BPO, and Hospitality.











VOICES OF SUCCESS



Nandhini, 19, from Ezhil Nagar, Chennai, comes from a financially challenged family. Her father, Murugan, is unemployed, while her mother, Vennila, works as a sweeper earning ₹9,000 per month. Despite her determination to pursue a B. Com degree, financial constraints forced her to discontinue college. Her journey took a positive turn when she joined our training program through a community mobiliser. With dedication, she gained valuable skills in workplace conduct, customer service, managing emotions, and understanding gender perspectives. Her perseverance paid off when she secured a job as a Sales Executive at Rare Love Fashion, earning ₹16,000 per month along with ESI and PF benefits. Nandhini's story exemplifies how determination, coupled with the right guidance, can transform challenges into opportunities and build a brighter future.

Kowsalya K, 20, from Kannagi Nagar, Chennai, has overcome significant family challenges while pursuing her dreams. Her father does not support the family financially, and her mother works as a cook earning ₹9,000 per month. To manage life better, Kowsalya and her mother moved in with her grandfather three years ago. Despite these difficulties, she completed her B. Com degree but initially faced challenges in finding employment. With guidance from our community mobiliser, she joined the training program, acquired essential skills in job readiness and interview preparation, and successfully secured a position at First Source with a monthly salary of ₹16,000. Kowsalya's journey demonstrates how determination, combined with the right support, can empower young women to overcome obstacles and confidently step into a brighter career.





Empowering Sustainability: Solar Plant Installation in Collaboration with Sungrow

As of our commitment part sustainability and resource efficiency, Asha Deep Foundation, in collaboration Sungrow, inaugurated a 20kW rooftop solar plant on March 9, 2025, at St. James Convent School, Ghaziabad. This milestone marks a significant step in long-standing addressing electricity challenges faced by the Foundation.



The installation was formally inaugurated by the Foundation's board members and representatives from Sungrow's installation team. Representatives from the installation team shared their appreciation for being part of the meaningful partnership, while the Foundation extended heartfelt thanks for their vital contribution to the initiative.

The event also featured a warm welcome by the children and a performance of an action song highlighting environmental conservation. The solar plant now ensures uninterrupted power supply to classrooms, computer labs, and evening study sessions—creating a more stable and supportive learning environment. The solar project not only significantly reduces electricity expenses, but it also serves as a practical introduction to clean energy, helping children understand the importance of environmental sustainability from an early age.









ST. JAMES CONVENT SCHOOL FOR UNDERPRIVILEGED CHILDREN, GHAZIABAD

St. James Convent School, located in Shahid Nagar, is a compassionate educational initiative serving underprivileged and minority children. Established in 1985, the school was founded to bridge the educational gap for children from economically weaker and marginalized communities.

Now a full-fledged institution, it offers education from preschool to elementary level, with an enrollment of 534 students. More than just academics, the school fosters a safe, inclusive, and value-based environment, promoting holistic development rooted in dignity, care, and respect.

St. James believes every child deserves the chance to learn and grow, regardless of background. It nurtures confident, capable, and compassionate individuals ready to shape a better future. Through its mission, the school continues to be a beacon of hope, empowering young minds, ensuring equal opportunities, and building a strong foundation for lifelong learning.







ANNUAL ACTIVITY HIGHLIGHTS

- At St. James Convent School, education goes beyond textbooks—nurturing minds, values, and life skills. Each day begins with spirited morning assemblies, setting the tone with values, discipline, and awareness.
- Students explore their potential through debates, essay writing, quizzes, and art competitions, while the House System (Nehru, Gandhi, Vivekananda, Tagore) builds leadership and teamwork. The Student Council takes charge of school life, giving students a voice and responsibility.









- Cultural pride shines through celebrations of national and festive days, and Sports Day brings energy, fitness, and team spirit to life. Special occasions like Teacher's Day and Women's Day are marked with thoughtful programs.
- Inside the classroom, interactive learning and AV sessions bring lessons alive.
 Outside, cutting and tailoring classes, awareness drives, and health check-ups support all-round growth. Plantation drives and nutrition initiatives (like fruit chaat) promote healthy, eco-friendly living.
- Regular PTMs strengthen school-home connections. The year concluded with the smooth conduct of SA-2 Exams (2024), closing another chapter of meaningful learning.

Ritesh's family moved from Chhatarpur, Madhya Pradesh, to Delhi in search of work, where his parents work as labourers. He studied in a government school until 4th grade and later joined St. James Convent School, Ghaziabad, for underprivileged children. Samra's middle-class family moved from Shahjahanpur, Uttar Pradesh, to Delhi. She has two brothers and one sister. Her father works as a tailor, and her mother is a homemaker. Samra, along with her siblings, studies at St. James Convent School for Underprivileged Children. She is an obedient, disciplined, and punctual student who excels in her studies. Samra aspires to become a teacher and make a positive impact through education.

Many of these children come from low-income families, where food insecurity directly impacts school attendance and learning.

Under this initiative, freshly prepared, nutritious meals are served on a regular basis, ensuring that students have the energy and focus required to actively participate in classroom activities. The program not only supports physical health but also fosters improved concentration, better retention, and consistent attendance. Teachers at St. James Convent School have observed a visible difference in classroom participation and overall enthusiasm among children who benefit from the program.

The collaboration emphasizes that nutrition and learning must go hand in hand. The Feeding India–Asha Deep Foundation partnership is thus laying the foundation for long-term empowerment by giving children the basic right to

learn, grow, and dream of a brighter future.









ST. JAMES CONVENT PRE SCHOOL FOR UNDERPRIVILEGED CHILDREN, DELHI

OVERVIEW

St. James convent Pre School has continued its commitment to providing a nurturing, safe, and joyful learning environment for young children. The academic session 2024–25 focused on fostering early childhood development through structured learning, play, and experiential activities.

DAILY ROUTINE AND ACTIVITIES

The daily schedule was designed to develop foundational skills and instill discipline among children. The following activities were part of the routine:

- Morning Prayer and Physical Exercise
- Reading and Writing Practice
- Drawing and Creative Expression
- Rhymes and Story Sessions
- Indoor and Outdoor Games (Sports Activity







EVENTS AND CELEBRATIONS

Throughout the year, children enthusiastically took part in several national and cultural celebrations. These events offered joyful learning opportunities and helped children understand the values of unity and diversity:

- 1. Republic Day
- 2. Independence Day
- 3. Christmas
- 4. Children's Day (Bal Mela)
- 5. Annual Sports Day
- 6. Teacher's Day

Each celebration included themed activities, performances, and hands-on involvement by the children, fostering confidence and team spirit.



CURRICULUM AND LEARNING AREAS

The curriculum focused on the all-round development of the child, covering the following key domains:

- 1. Language and Literacy
- 2. Numeracy
- 3. Science and Exploration
- 4. Social and Emotional Learning
- 5. Fine and Gross Motor Development







TEACHING METHODOLOGY

To make learning enjoyable and meaningful, the school adopted the following approaches:

- Play-based learning
- Hands-on activities
- Storytelling and role-play

These methods helped stimulate curiosity and engagement among children.

GALI PRE SCHOOL: EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

Early childhood education plays a crucial role in shaping the future of young children, especially those from marginalized communities. For children from ragpicking families, access to preschool not only offers foundational learning but also provides a safe, structured environment that nurtures their physical, emotional, and social development.

The Gali Preschool program provides early childhood education to children aged 2½ to 4 years from rag-picking communities in North East Delhi. Operated within community spaces, the preschool offers a nurturing and inclusive environment rooted in storytelling and play-based learning methods.

Throughout the year, children were engaged in activities that support their overall development:

- Basic literacy learning: Alphabets, rhymes, and writing readiness.
- Personal hygiene training: Washing hands, maintaining cleanliness, organizing personal items.
- Moral and social learning: Discipline, manners, sharing, and group participation.
- Celebrations: National festivals, cultural events, and birthdays.







- Sports Day: Fostering physical activity and team spirit.
- Health camp: Free health check-up and awareness sessions for all enrolled children.
- Parental involvement: Regular Parent-Teacher Meetings (PTMs) were conducted to encourage active participation.
- Community outreach: Door-to-door mobilization was carried out to enroll and retain children.











Gali Preschool continues to provide foundational learning to children

from marginalized communities helping them transition smoothly into formal schooling while building a strong base in hygiene, behaviour, and early academics.



SHIKSHA PROJECT: EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM FOR THE RAG PICKING COMMUNITY CHILDREN

Asha Deep Foundation's Shiksha Project is a community-based educational initiative aimed at uplifting rag-picker children aged 3 to 14, many of whom are first-generation learners from low-income families.

During 2024–2025, the project continued to provide remedial education in core subjects through interactive and inclusive teaching methods tailored to their

learning needs.

Life Skills Sessions:

Children attended regular sessions on hygiene, emotional well-being, communication, and social behavior.

These sessions aimed to build confidence, self-awareness, and healthy habits essential for personal and academic growth.

Nutritional Support:

Through a partnership with Feeding India, children received nutritious breakfast and lunch daily. This support improved their health, reduced absenteeism, and enhanced focus and participation in learning activities.

Parent Meetings:

Monthly parent meetings promoted the value of education and encouraged consistent school attendance. Parents were guided on how to support learning at home and were updated on their child's progress.

Community Engagement:

Awareness activities and outreach sessions engaged local communities in supporting children's education and well-being. These efforts helped create a more inclusive and encouraging environment for the children.



Through this integrated and child-centric approach, the Shiksha Project continues to uphold its commitment to nurturing the educational, physical, emotional and

social well-being of the most vulnerable children in the community. By combining remedial education, nutritional support, life skills training, and parental involvement, the project creates a strong foundation for children who are often excluded from formal learning systems.













Feeding India – A Zomato Giveback with Asha Deep Foundation's Shiksha Project

Feeding India, acquired by Zomato is committed to eradicating hunger and ensuring food security for vulnerable communities. Through its community kitchens and the "Feeding India Give Back" program, it provides daily nutritious meals while also engaging individuals and organizations to contribute by donating meals via Zomato.

In collaboration with Asha Deep Foundation's Shiksha program, this initiative reaches children from rag picking communities who are among the most marginalized. While Feeding India addresses their immediate need for healthy food, Shiksha provides access to education through bridge courses, remedial support, and mainstream school enrollment.

This integrated model removes the barrier of hunger, enhances school attendance, and empowers children to move beyond rag picking towards a future of dignity, learning, and opportunity.









EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL EXCHANGE PROGRAM

YUVA: Inclusive Holistic Development of youth through Skill Training and Economic Empowerment with special emphasis for youth who are diversely abled.

YUVA is a skill training and economic empowerment initiative run by Asha Deep Foundation (ADF) in partnership with HCL Foundation. The foundation is focused on empowering adults through impactful skill training and targeted support that meets their needs. ADF also provides essential relief by offering food assistance. Additionally, the foundation plays a pivotal role in helping individuals obtain a UDID Certificate as part of the government's "Unique ID for Persons with Disabilities" initiative. This initiative establishes a comprehensive national database for Persons with Disabilities (PWDs), ensuring that each individual receives a unique disability identity card. This initiative not only promotes inclusivity but also enhances the ability to monitor beneficiaries' financial and physical progress at various levels. ADF nurtures more than skills—we nurture voice, visibility, and valor.

Objectives of the YUVA Project

- 1. Empower Youth with Disabilities To ensure equal opportunities for youth with disabilities by providing access to skill development, confidence-building initiatives, and pathways to meaningful employment.
- 2. Deliver Employability Skills To implement a structured 3-month training program that covers: Basic Computer knowledge, English Communication, IT Skills, Workplace Readiness, Soft Skills and Personality Development.



- 3. Facilitate Sustainable Livelihoods To support trained youth in securing employment with reputable companies such as HCL, TATA, and Maruti, enabling long-term economic independence.
- 4. Promote Inclusive Learning Environments To foster inclusive settings where approximately 75% of participants are differently abled and 25% are non-disabled peers, promoting mutual learning, respect, and unity.
- 5. Enhance Confidence and Social Integration To strengthen self-esteem and interpersonal skills through regular interactive activities, including Mock Interviews, Group Discussions, Debates, Field Visits, Exposure and Programs.
- 6. Support Flexible and Home-Based Training To ensure inclusivity for youth with limited mobility by offering home-based and remote learning options tailored to their specific needs.

Impact

This year, we successfully trained 100 individuals through our program a diverse group that included 50 persons with disabilities (PWDs), 25 transgender individuals, and 25 non-PWDs. We are proud to share that 62 trainees have secured employment across various sectors. Additionally, 3 have chosen to pursue higher education, and 11 have taken entrepreneurial steps by starting their own businesses. These outcomes reflect the growing impact of inclusive training and livelihood support in transforming lives and building a more equitable society.















VOICES OF SUCCESS

M. Jayanthi, from Chennai, is a true example of resilience and determination. Affected by polio at the age of seven, she has relied on walking sticks for mobility but never allowed her disability to define her. After completing her 12th standard and undergoing skill training through the Yuvakendra Police Boys and Girls Club supported by HCL Foundation, she started preparing and selling millet-based snacks. Today, Jayanthi runs a snack stall, participates in fairs and exhibitions, and has created opportunities for others by employing two economically disadvantaged women. With support from Asha Deep Foundation and HCL Foundation, she received a CNG auto-rickshaw to strengthen her business operations. Jayanthi now stands as a proud entrepreneur who has transformed challenges into opportunities, uplifting both her family and her community.

B. Anandi, from Chennai, has lived with physical challenges since infancy after being affected by polio, yet her determination to live independently has always driven her forward. With the support of her husband Balamurugan, the couple care for their 15-year-old daughter while running a home-based business producing cloth and jute bags. Anandi enhanced her skills by joining the Yuvakendra Project under Asha Deep Foundation, supported by HCL Foundation, where she gained knowledge in entrepreneurship and business management. While the business grew, lack of reliable transportation limited their reach, when they received a CNG auto through Asha Deep Foundation and HCL Foundation. This support enabled them to expand their customer base, increase their income, and overcome mobility challenges. Today, Anandi stands as an inspiring example of resilience and how timely support can transform lives.





ASHA VOCATIONAL AND TECHNICAL TRAINING INSTITUTE (AVTTI) - DELHI

Asha Vocational Technical Training Institute (AVTTI), Delhi, was launched in 2022 with the goal of equipping underprivileged youth and women with livelihood-oriented skills. The center caters to trainees in the 15–45 years age group, offering them practical and market-relevant vocational training.

AVTTI offers certified courses in the following

trades:

- Cutting & Tailoring
- Beauty Culture
- Computer Basics
- Spoken English

Upon completion of their respective courses, trainees are awarded certificates, which help them in accessing job opportunities or starting small businesses from home.



To ensure wide community participation, community mobilization is carried out every Saturday.

Activities include:

- Door-to-door awareness campaigns
- Interaction with families to motivate enrollment
- Special focus on encouraging women and girls to join

Throughout the year, the center also focused on personality development, life skills, and celebration of festivals fostering a joyful and inclusive learning environment.



Regular follow-up is done with former trainees to:

- Track their employment status
- Provide mentoring or career guidance
- Link them with advanced skill training or income opportunities

A major highlight of the year was the Annual Certificate Distribution and Exhibition, where:

- Trainees showcased their stitching, design, and beauty work
- · Outstanding performers were recognized and awarded
- Community members and guests appreciated the transformation in the trainees

AVTTI continues to play a key role in enabling confidence, dignity, and financial independence among women and youth, contributing toward sustainable community development.











ASHA VOCATIONAL AND TECHNICAL TRAINING INSTITUTE (AVTTI) GHAZIABHAD

AVTTI is an initiative run by the Asha Deep Foundation. Asha Vocational Technical Training Institute (AVTTI), located in Ghaziabad, continues to be a beacon of opportunity for underprivileged youth, especially women and girls from marginalized communities. The institute is committed to equipping them with vocational and life skills that foster economic independence, self-reliance, and social upliftment.

The institute was founded on the belief that skill development is a powerful tool for poverty alleviation, women's empowerment, and sustainable livelihood generation. In the year 2024–2025, AVTTI trained youth across multiple domains including tailoring, beautician skills, computer literacy, and embroidery arts. It is structured as a sixmonth course.



CORE OBJECTIVES

- To provide access to affordable vocational training for underprivileged communities.
- To enhance employability among youth and women through job-oriented courses.
- To promote self-reliance through small-scale entrepreneurship and home-based businesses.
- To build confidence, communication, and life skills for holistic development.

VOCATIONAL COURSES OFFERED

Cutting & Tailoring

Practical garment stitching, pattern drafting, and finishing techniques for home-based tailoring or boutique work.





Beautician & Makeup

Training in facial care, hairstyling, bridal makeup, threading, mehndi, and hygiene practices.

Computer Literacy & Digital Skills

Basics of MS Office, typing, internet use, and job-oriented digital knowledge.

Zari Zardozi & Embroidery

Traditional embroidery techniques including Zari, mirror work, and bead designs for garments and accessories.

AVTTI follows a strong community-based approach. Trained mobilizers visit low-income areas to identify and counsel youth—especially girls—for vocational training.



They support trainees throughout the 6-month course to ensure regular attendance and completion. After training, AVTTI links graduates with local salons, boutiques, and businesses for placement. Many also start their own home-based services in tailoring, beauty, or embroidery, gaining financial independence and dignity.









ASHA SKILL INSTITUTE



Asha Skill Institute was launched in 2016 as a flagship vocational training program under Asha Deep Foundation, with the mission of economically empowering underprivileged girls and women. The program is designed to support females aged 15 years and above, without an upper age limit, recognizing that it is never too late to learn or to become self-reliant.

The initiative focuses on skill development in Fashion Designing and Tailoring, aiming to equip trainees with practical, employment-oriented skills. The broader objective is to help participants gain confidence, become financially independent, and contribute to their family's wellbeing.

To ensure participation from the most marginalized communities, the foundation's team of mobilizers conducted door-to-door surveys across communities. Through household visits and community interactions, they identified eligible girls and women, counselled families about the importance of vocational training, and supported the admission process.









The training program runs in structured batches throughout the year. Key elements include:

- Basic and Advanced Tailoring Skills
- Fashion Designing Techniques
- Fabric Cutting, Stitching, and Finishing
- Use of Sewing Machines and Tools
- Entrepreneurship and Business Readiness Sessions

During the reporting year, the institute trained many women and girls. Most of them have gone on to:

- Start home-based tailoring units
- Receive placement in local boutiques, tailoring units, and garment shops
- Partner with small businesses for custom orders
- Contribute financially to their households, improving quality of life

A highlight of the year was the Annual Day and Alumni Meet, where outstanding trainees were recognized for their achievements, growth, and dedication. The event served as a platform for current students to gain inspiration from alumni who have successfully built their careers after completing the training.











SKILL TRAINING AND PLACEMENTS OF YOUTH

Supported by:



Asha Deep Foundation, in collaboration with Jubilant Food Works Limited, successfully implemented a Skill Training and Placement Program for Persons with Disabilities (PWDs). The initiative aimed at equipping youth with essential job-oriented skills while fostering empowerment, independence, and long-term livelihood opportunities.

The training focused on Quick Service Restaurant (QSR) skills, along with computer skills, food safety practices, and personality development sessions. To provide real-world exposure, trainees were taken on visits to popular food outlets, including Domino's, where they gained first-hand experience of industry operations.

To ensure structured learning, mid-term and final assessments were conducted, enabling both trainers and trainees to track progress and enhance competencies. Upon completion, the participants were supported through placement opportunities in the QSR industry, opening doors to sustainable employment.

This year, the program successfully trained and placed two batches with a total of 60 trainees (30 in each batch). Special emphasis was given to empowering differently-abled youth, helping them gain confidence and market-relevant skills for a brighter future.

Through this initiative, Asha Deep Foundation continues to bridge the gap between training and employment, enabling marginalized youth to contribute meaningfully to the workforce.

ASHA NIKETAN BOYS HOSTEL

Asha Niketan Boys Hostel is one of the core initiatives of the Asha Deep Foundation, dedicated to the care and development of orphaned, semi-orphaned, abandoned, and destitute boys below the age of 18. Established in 1994, Asha Niketan is operating under the belief that every child deserves a safe and nurturing environment, Asha Niketan provides more than just shelter — it offers a home, hope, and a future.

Current Reach and Services

Asha Niketan Boys Hostel provides a safe and nurturing environment for children who have faced difficult and vulnerable circumstances. The home ensures their overall well-being



through structured care, education, emotional support, and opportunities for holistic development. These children are provided with:

- Secure residential care in a safe, family-like atmosphere.
- Nutritious meals and health support, ensuring their physical well-being.
- Quality education, with all boys attending St. James Convent School, where they receive regular academic support and attention.
- Counseling and emotional care, helping them heal from trauma and grow into confident individuals.
- Extracurricular and developmental activities, including participation in cultural events, sports, and skill-building sessions.



Holistic Development Approach

The program goes beyond basic needs by fostering the children's social, educational, and emotional growth:

- Daily routines are structured to promote discipline and a sense of responsibility.
- Weekly group sessions and celebrations nurture unity and joy.
- Emphasis is placed on character-building, moral values, and self-reliance.

Partnership with St. James Convent School

- All resident boys are enrolled at St. James Convent School, where they benefit from:
- An inclusive learning environment.
- Tailored academic support plans to match individual learning needs.





ASHA NIKETAN GIRLS HOME, DELHI

·Asha Niketan Girls Home, located in Delhi, was started in the year 1996 and is run under the vision of ministering to girls and women. It provides a safe and nurturing home for orphaned, semi-orphaned, abandoned, lost, and destitute girl children. Beneficiaries are referred through Child Welfare Committees, partner NGOs, and relatives, ensuring support reaches those most in need. Safety and protection of the girls remain the highest priority, with secure premises and regular monitoring. Regular health check-ups and nutritious meals are provided to promote physical growth and overall well-being.

TThe hostel also offers personal hygiene guidance, counseling, and emotional support, creating a family-like environment where every girl feels valued. All residents are enrolled at St. James Convent School, receiving quality education and academic guidance, alongside participation in festivals, extracurricular activities, and life skills workshops that foster confidence, resilience, and holistic growth. The hostel emphasizes peer learning and leadership, where senior girls mentor younger ones, and special sessions on life skills, digital literacy, and career guidance prepare the older girls for future independence.

The year 2024–2025 further strengthened the hostel's commitment to ensuring dignity, safety, and equal opportunities, empowering girls to overcome past adversities and build secure, fulfilling, and independent futures.







ASHIYANA HOME FOR GIRLS, GHAZIABHAD

Ashiyana Home for Girls, run by Asha Deep Foundation, provides a safe and nurturing environment for girls who are orphaned, semi-orphaned, abandoned, or from extremely vulnerable backgrounds. The home offers not just food, clothing, and shelter but also emotional support, education, health care, and life skill development.

Throughout the year, the girls participated in various activities including academic learning, recreational events, counselling sessions, and celebrations of national festivals. Special focus was given to their overall development through regular health check-ups, personality development programs, and legal aid when needed. Ashiyana Home also works closely with child protection agencies, local authorities, and community stakeholders to ensure the rights of every child is safeguarded.

This year, efforts were also made to reconnect some children with their extended families, wherever possible, while others were prepared for independent living through vocational training and career guidance.

DAY CARE CENTRE FOR SENIOR CITIZENS

Life is a journey that unfolds through distinct stages, each bringing its own joys and challenges. In this stage, both physical strength and mental sharpness may decline, making it a time when empathy, care, and support become more important than ever.

Recognizing the significance of this life stage, Asha Deep Foundation has expanded its mission beyond supporting women and children to also embrace and care for our cherished elderly citizens. Many senior citizens find themselves isolated or neglected, particularly in urban low-income communities.

Our Daycare Centre for Senior Citizens provides a safe, respectful, and engaging

environment where the elderly are supported daily with:

Nutritious meals and health monitoring

- Recreational and therapeutic activities
- Counselling and emotional support
- Opportunities to socialize and share experiences

Through this initiative, we aim to ensure that our elders have a safe and welcoming space where they feel valued and supported.







SUPPORT FOR WIDOWS AND DESTITUTE WOMEN

Asha Deep Foundation is committed to uplifting marginalized communities, with a special focus on widows and destitute women. Recognizing the multiple hardships these women face including financial instability, social exclusion, and emotional distress the foundation has implemented a range of initiatives to ensure their welfare and empowerment.

Nutritional Support:

Under the Monthly Ration Kits Program, essential food items, fresh vegetables, and fruits are provided to women and their families ensuring that they have access to nutritious meals.

Skill Development and Livelihood Support:

The foundation empowers women to achieve financial independence through various vocational training programs. These programs equip women to support their livelihoods and build self-reliance.

Counselling and Awareness Programs:

Asha Deep Foundation also provides guidance and counselling to women through awareness and empowerment-oriented programs. These sessions help beneficiaries develop confidence and overcome challenges.

Through these initiatives, Asha Deep Foundation continues to strengthen the dignity, and well-being of widows and destitute women, helping them lead empowered and self-sufficient lives.







SUPPORT FOR PERSONS WITH AND SUPPORT FOR PERSONS WITH AND WOMEN, YOUTH, AND WOMEN

Asha Deep Foundation is deeply committed to building an inclusive society where children, youth, and women with disabilities are empowered to live with dignity, purpose, and independence.

Through early childhood and school education programs inclusive teaching is practiced to accommodate children with disabilities in schools and care centres. The centre ensures formal and extra-curricular activities, with a flexible education timetable, prayers, parent-teacher meetings, and a special food menu with high hygiene standards, alongside recreational and cultural activities to foster self-reliance.

Under the community health programs, health camps are conducted to identify and support children and women with disabilities. The early intervention efforts help minimize developmental delays and improve long-term outcomes. Special focus has been placed on supporting children with muscular dystrophy, a group that requires consistent and specialized attention. To address both nutritional and social vulnerabilities, monthly ration kits are provided to affected families.

In the Livelihood projects Persons with disabilities are identified by community mobilisation. It focuses on holistic development through Skill training, Vocational training, technical training and economic empowerment. These trainings are tailored to enhance employability and self-confidence. They are rendered support for job placement and entrepreneurship enabling them to find sustainable livelihood paths.

The foundation promotes community mobilization and inclusivity through awareness programs and training of community leaders. It builds the capacity of frontline workers and educators to better support Persons with Disabilities (PWDs). Psycho-socio care is provided through individual and group counselling to address emotional distress and stigma. Families and caregivers receive counselling to strengthen emotional and practical support. Awareness and life skills sessions further enhance self-worth, confidence, and interpersonal skills.










PSYCHO-SOCIAL CARE

Many underprivileged children, adolescents, and persons with disabilities face psychological challenges that often go unnoticed. Low self-esteem, anxiety, and trauma are common, shaping their daily lives and limiting their potential. To address these issues, ADF provides dedicated counselling, awareness programs, play therapy, yoga sessions, and audio-visual learning activities. These interventions aim to strengthen emotional resilience, enhance physical and mental well-being, and foster self-confidence. Counselling support is also extended to parents, ensuring a nurturing and understanding home environment for the children's overall growth.











SPORTS FOR DEVELOPMENT

At Asha Deep Foundation, structured sports and recreational activities have played a vital role in fostering positive growth among children. Through these initiatives, children developed essential life skills such as teamwork, discipline, leadership, and resilience.

Throughout the year, regular sports sessions, friendly matches, Annual Day celebrations, and Sports Day events were conducted across our centers. These activities provided a safe and inclusive environment for children to express themselves, stay active, and build self-confidence.

Sports also served as a powerful tool for psychosocial support, helping children navigate stress, trauma, and emotional challenges. By embedding play and physical activity into our programs, we nurtured healthier, happier, and more socially connected children—better equipped to face life's challenges both on and off the field.











MONITORING AND EVALUATION

At Asha Deep Foundation, Monitoring and Evaluation(M&E) is a vital component of the organizational strategy, ensuring that every intervention is aligned with the mission to uplift and empower marginalized communities. Through a structured and participatory approach, M&E helps us remain accountable, evidence-driven, and continuously responsive to the needs of the people we serve.

The purpose and focus of M&E system is:

- To keep a track on the activities of the projects and measure progress against defined objectives.
- To Assess the relevance, efficiency, effectiveness, and impact of the projects.
- To Ensure transparency and accountability in all the projects.
- To Foster a culture of learning and adaptation within the organization.

The Key strategies to maintain consistency and effectiveness are:

- To have before and after assessments to understand the changes in community conditions.
- To prepare monthly and quarterly reports to track the work of the projects.
- To have group discussions and get feedback from the community to determine the impact of the projects.
- To collect case studies and success stories to highlight individual and collective transformation.

Asha Deep Foundation adopts a community-centered approach where local leaders and field workers help track progress and identify gaps. Their insights make programs more inclusive and effective. Evaluation findings promote learning, accountability, and improvement. Regular reviews identify what works and how to deepen impact. Through Monitoring and Evaluation, the Foundation ensures transparency and meaningful change.









HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT AND TRAINING

Asha Deep Foundation (ADF) invested in Human Resource Development to strengthen its community impact. The human mind is not innately creative—it requires practical exposure, guided learning, and real-world experience to thrive. Through targeted trainings, ADF built skills in leadership, legal awareness, and community engagement. Focus areas included child protection, healthcare, sensitization on key laws related to child safety. These efforts also extended to empowering youth, educators, and community leaders, ensuring long-term grassroots change.

KEY INITIATIVES

- ADF organized trainings and awareness sessions for children, women, teachers, staff, social workers, and law enforcement personnel. These initiatives fostered protection, accountability, and empowerment across communities.
- Special training sessions for police personnel focused on sensitizing them to the provisions of the Juvenile Justice (JJ) Act and Protection of Children from Sexual Offences POCSO Act., as part of ADF's advocacy efforts.
- In collaboration with the Delhi Commission for Protection of Child Rights (DCPCR), ADF implemented a major training program in 50 schools across North-East Delhi and Shahdara regions. The objective was to raise awareness about child protection issues among teachers, non-teaching staff, and students.
- As a significant outcome of this initiative, three Child Protection Committees (CPCs) were established—one each for teachers, non-teaching staff, and students—ensuring continuous vigilance and responsiveness towards child safety within schools.

ADF promotes learning through mentoring and feedback, empowering individuals to grow and contribute to the community.




